Emma Johnson, one of Britain's best loved musicians, and one of the few clarinettists to have established an international career as a soloist, appears with the Harpham Quartet at Bournemouth Chamber Music's next concert at Talbot Heath School on Saturday 8th May at 3pm.

Emma has performed across Europe, the USA and the Far East, as well as in Africa and Australia in venues such as the Kennedy Center, the Concertgebouw, the Louvre and the Barbican.

She is to play two wonderful Clarinet Quintets – the famous Quintet by Brahms, and the astonishing Quintet by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, a work of remarkable subtlety and sophistication, rhythmically exuberant and complex, music that deserves to be better known.

The Harpham String Quartet is steadily becoming regarded as a formidable new talent. They have been selected as Park Lane Group Young Artists, and performed at the opening night of the 2008 New Year Series at the Purcell Room. They open the concert with Puccini's exquisite poem for string quartet, Chrysanthemums.
